Cat Parks

Republican Party of Texas Vice Chairman

Republican Party Vice Chair Cat Parks believes strongly in rugged individualism, the importance of education, and the power of the grass roots. She is passionate about creating cohesive relationships to grow the Party by harnessing the talent and conviction of “We the People” of the Lone Star State. Small-business owner, former University coach and college adjunct instructor, cancer-survivor, certified Emergency Room nurse- her path has been diverse.

Cat is the 2020 recipient of the Steve Munisteri Award presented by Governor Greg Abbott, Lt. Governor Dan Patrick, and Chairman James Dickey for, “the volunteer who made the greatest impact on the Republican Party of Texas.”

Cat serves as the County Chairman of Hamilton County, a Board Member of the Texas Republican County Chairman’s Association, a Patron of the Texas Federation of Republican Women and also serves on the Communication Task Force. In 2019, Cat was named Chair of the Candidate Recruitment Task Force, under which she led the statewide effort to identify all Democrat incumbents for Congressional, Senate, House, Judicial, & local races from County Judge through Constable for 2020 and create a strategic plan to recruit Republican candidates.

This successful effort began with the creation of a diverse task force of Regional Directors who identified and activated conservative candidates in major metropolitan areas: DFW, Austin, San Antonio, Houston, El Paso, & the Rio Grande Valley. The group quickly identified a need for more education among candidates and campaign teams.

Cat organized the Leadership Institute Texas Tour: Campaign Schools put on by a collaborative effort among the RPT, TFRW, TRCCA, and Texans for Greg Abbott. Taught by the Leadership Institute, the effort coordinated 40+ educators from 17 states with 70+ local hosts in over 30 Texas counties to train over 1,300 conservatives across Texas. Additionally, an online resource was created for the first time for candidates to have access to 8+ hours of educational online campaign instruction, legal advice, and all forms in one place.

Seeing a need to strengthen the judicial benches, she enlisted the help of Supreme Court Justice Jeff Boyd who generously traveled and spoke with over one hundred potential District Court candidates in Dallas, Houston, San Antonio, El Paso, & Hidalgo. The importance of having qualified judges who do not legislate from the bench cannot be stressed enough.

Without a doubt, Texas’ recruitment efforts have been a success. Over 3,000 Republican Candidates ran– more than double the number of Democrats. The team recruited the highest number of female & minority candidates in RPT History, and the state of Texas made national headlines by doubling the number of female Congressional candidates. Additionally, the CRTF is responsible for recruiting Jessica Lewis, the strong, principled conservative candidate who will be running against Judge Moyé, the Dallas judge who jailed salon owner Shelly Luther.

Prior to her work with the Party, Cat co-founded and organized an 800+ member grass-roots organization that fought to protect agricultural property rights (private and commercial) proposed in an urban Land Development Code. After 3 years, serving as President, the group successfully altered the Code, passed resolutions to protect agricultural economy and culture, gained access to a National Preserve for the first time, and received national recognition for advocacy by the American Horse Council.

Educated at the University of Illinois, Cat holds a BA in Spanish with a minor in International Relations/ Latin American Studies and an RN from Parkland College. Before venturing into small-business ownership, she worked as Trauma nurse and volunteered as a Spanish Medical Interpreter.

Cat has been married to Dr. John Parks a native Texas for 11 years. Dr. Parks served in the Navy and is retired anesthesiologist. They share 10 year old son Pierce, 4 grown step children- Lura, Trevor, Hunter, and Clayton, and 12 grandchildren.

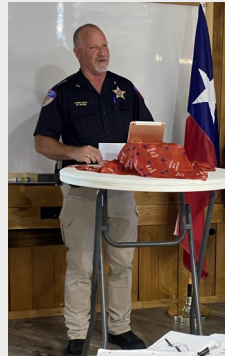

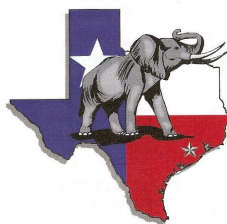

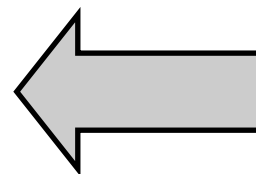

Legislative Update

Fort Bend Propositions on the November Ballot - Do Your Homework!

Here is what they say:

In the November 3, 2020, General Election, Fort Bend County voters will consider a bond proposal on a variety of countywide parks projects. Bond elections allow voters to decide whether or not to use long-term financing through the sale of bonds for major capital improvement projects such as new construction and expansion of roads, parks and trails. This election is being held in conjunction with the November General Election for Federal, State, and County offices and the Fort Bend County mobility bond proposal. The total amount of bonds sought for Proposition B is \$38.4 million.

Why is the County Requesting the Issuance of Park Bonds?

Fort Bend County has ten active parks, three leased parks, and four community centers. Our parks feature walking trails, playgrounds, basketball courts, baseball fields, soccer fields, football fields, cricket fields, splash pads, fishing holes, and other outdoor recreation. We also offer pavilions, community centers, and Fair Ground building rentals for private events.

These resources periodically require renovations and/or replacements due to their regular "life expectancy," natural wear and tear from daily use and constant exposure to the elements (steady sunlight, rainfall, heat, etc.) As the County's population grows there is also a need to add additional park infrastructure and amenities to keep up with demand.

How will the Park Bonds be used?

The new funding would allow the County to execute large-scale upgrades and enhancements to its parks. These include new playgrounds, walking and exercise trails, outdoor fitness equipment, athletic spaces, increased lighting, shade structures, renovated restrooms, community center improvements and ADA accessibility improvements.

Will the Use of Bonds Increase the Tax Rate?

No. The Commissioners Court included a commitment in the Parks Bond Order to not increase the tax rate for the issuance of the Parks Bonds once issued.

This is what the ballot says:

Proposition A—The issuance of bonds in the amount of **\$218,185,000** for the construction, maintenance and operation of county roads, including roads within the cities of Kendelton, Rosenberg, Fairchilds, Needville, Richmond, Stafford, Missouri City, Meadows Place, Fulshear, and Sugar Land, and the imposition of taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds.

Proposition B—The issuance of bonds in the amount of \$38,400,00 for county park facilities and the imposition of taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds.

Examples of what to count for your activity hours:

- ⇒ General Meetings, count prep and drive time only
- ⇒ Candidate forums, campaign events, club fundraisers or other election activity, count hours of prep, drive, and time at the event
- ⇒ Leadership Events: Campaign Management Schools (offered by the Counties, etc.), Get Out the Vote Seminars, Poll Watcher Training, Election Judge and Election Clerk Training, and Leadership Training
- ⇒ Block walking, phone calls for a candidate
- ⇒ Volunteering outside the polls for a candidate
- ⇒ Working inside the polls as a volunteer—if you are paid as an election judge or poll worker please do not count hours unless you donate your pay to a county party, your local Federated Republican Women's Club, a candidate, or the TFRW PAC
- ⇒ Club Officers and Committee Chairs, hours worked as your position
- ⇒ Attend and volunteer at your Precinct, Senate District and/or State Conventions
- ⇒ Attend the RNC National Convention
- ⇒ **DO NOT** count the hours spent at club's monthly meetings. **DO** count the travel time – how long it takes you to get to the meeting and to get home.
- ⇒ Working at County Party headquarters

All of the activity hours turned in to TFRW are added to total hours accumulated by other TFRW clubs in Texas. TFRW clubs that turn in top hours receive rewards at both the TFRW and NFRW conventions in 2021.
